Re : BC Restart Plan Phase 3

As most would be aware by now, tomorrow, 1st July 2021 marks another significant step towards the Provincial Government's recovery plan, nigh on 67 weeks since declaring a state of emergency.

The state of emergency will be lifted tonight at 11:59pm and tomorrow the mask wearing mandate will no longer be in effect. Businesses will also no longer be required to update and keep active a Covid-19 Safety Plan. How every business responds to these changes will vary but for our Club these changes will mean the following;

- Masks will no longer be required in the Clubhouse/Restaurant/Proshop/Patio
- The restaurant will slowly move to facilitate tables of more than 6 people.
- The restaurant may now have indoor functions of up to 69 people in attendance (50 people or 50% of capacity, whichever is greater)
- Resumption of normal entry and exit points for the restaurant.
- The driving range will no longer have restrictive hours for drop in use for non-members.
- Flagsticks and rakes (already back in play) as well as water stations back out on Holes #4, #7 & #15
- Movement between tables is currently still not permitted.
- Locker Rooms not yet available.

For many people, these changes will be welcomed while others may feel that they are happening too quickly. Having discussed the above with numerous staff I know that there is a mix of emotions/feelings about these changes. Some staff and members may choose to continue to wear masks when indoors. Not all staff have yet received their second dose of vaccination and I can only assume that this applies to many members as well. During the next month I would ask all members and guests to be respectful of one another's situation and not yet expect a full 'life back to normal' status. We are not there just yet.

Finally, again, I would like to commend everyone, both members and staff, on how you have dealt with and adjusted to the multitude of changes, updates and inconveniences thrown at you due to the Covid-10 pandemic. As mentioned in a previous update, at a personal level each one of us has experienced the past 67 weeks differently, but at the golf course, by and large we all dealt with it together and we made it work. Thank you !
